

*Religion and Society in Central and Eastern Europe (RASCEE) presents, in its current issue, four articles and five book reviews. The four articles cover such topics as the explanatory factors of diverse religious changes in Latvia and Estonia, such as the strength of the Communist legacy and the role of religious organizations in opposition movements during the Communist era; the place and role of different types of authority in online Catholic forums in Poland; the features of Roma religiosity in Hungary; and – also in Hungary – the intergenerational transmission of religiosity in large families. The book reviews present recent publications on the relationship between Russian Orthodoxy and human rights; on Orthodox identities in Western Europe; on religion and national identities in Europe; on the role of religion in social cooperation and conflicts; and on the social history of Satanism.*
